Resolution adopted by the Twenty-fourth Continental Congress:
Descendants of polygamous marriage are not acceptable as members of this Society.

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+ Classes, 1790

Any woman may be eligible for membership who is of the age of eighteen years, and who is descended from a man or woman who, with unflinching loyalty, rendered material aid to the cause of Independence; from a recognized patriot, a soldier or sailor or a civil officer in one of the several Colonies or States, or of the United Colonies or States; *Provided that the applicant be acceptable to the Society.*

Official proof of service must be furnished with the application; also references to authorities quoted, to show line of descent. *Where reference is made to unpublished or inaccessible records, the applicant must file duplicate certified copies of same.* Statements based upon tradition alone cannot be considered.

ANCESTOR'S SERVICES

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

I am Johnston Muma, a brother of applicant (Anne C. Muma) has been admitted to the Society of "The Sons of the Revolution" in the State of California City of Los Angeles. The name of Muma was taken about 1870 by Benj. Franklin Mumma although the name is still kept in its original spelling of Mumma by branches of the family in different parts of the U. S. Private, 5th Co., 4th Batt. Lancaster Co. militia, 1781. Capt. Alex Scott, Jr., Col. Seigler.
